MEMORANDUM

1. GENERAL REGULATIONS

THE PETER HAWORTH MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP/CICELY HAWORTH WAHL SCHOLARSHIP/
ROBERT AND CICELY SCHOLARSHIP are available to students as follows:

PETER HAWORTH MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP	:	MEN AND WOMEN
CICELY HAWORTH WAHL SCHOLARSHIP	:	WOMEN ONLY
ROBERT AND CICELY WAHL SCHOLARSHIP	:	MEN AND WOMEN

The Scholarships will be awarded for post-graduate studies at the Universities of **OXFORD, CAMBRIDGE or LONDON**, only and may be held for two years in the case of a Course of study for a Bachelor's or Masters Degree or for a period of three years in the case of a Doctorate. On completion of the intended course of study the Scholarship shall terminate.

After his/her election to a Scholarship, the successful candidate has still, however, to be found a place in the College of the University concerned. There is no guarantee of a place and the award of a Scholarship will not be ratified by the Trustees until the student elected has been accepted for admission by a College.

The value of a Scholarship at present will not be less than R1 200-00 per year and will not exceed 2/3 of the Rhodes Scholarships per year. This sum may not be sufficient to meet necessary expenses for term time and vacations and students who are able to supplement it from their own resources will usually find it advantageous to do so.

Cost of travel overseas must be borne by the Scholar.

2. CONDITIONS OF ELIGIBILITY

- 2.1 Candidates must be graduates of a South African University.
- 2.2 Canvassing on behalf of any candidate may disqualify him/her.

3. BASIS OF SELECTION

In awarding Scholarships the following qualifications will be taken into consideration – qualification 3.1 and 3.2 being considered the most important:-

- 3.1 Literary and scholastic attainments.
- 3.2 Qualities of manhood/womanhood, truth, courage, devotion to duty, sympathy, kindness, unselfishness and fellowship.

- 3.3 Exhibition of moral force and character and of instinct to lead and to take an interest in his/her fellow students.
- 3.4 Physical vigor as shown by fondness for outdoor activities

Quality of character, personality and intellect are the most important requirements in a scholar and it is upon this that the Selection Committee will insist. Success in being elected to office in student organisations may or may not be evidence of leadership in the true sense of the word. Leadership will be regarded as consisting of moral courage and of interest in one's fellowmen, quite as much as of the more aggressive qualities.

Continuing physical vigor to enable a scholar to make an effective contribution to his/her world is more important than his/her athletic prowess. Poverty does not give a special claim to a Scholarship and the strongest candidate will be appointed regardless of his/her financial circumstances.

4. METHOD OF SELECTION

Each candidate for a Scholarship is required to apply to the Secretary on or before the dates published from time to time using the application form supplied with this Memorandum and furnishing the material specified.

5. MATERIAL TO BE SUBMITTED BY CANDIDATES

FOUR certified copies of the following to be furnished:-

- 5.1 Identification Document;
- 5.2 Certified evidence by the Registrar or other responsible officer of the University as to courses taken, degrees, honours or other academic distinctions, which have been obtained. If a candidate has left the University before applying for a Scholarship, he/she should also state their occupation since leaving.
- 5.3 A signed statement by the candidate as to his/her general interests and activities (including sport), his/her proposed course of study at one of the named Universities and the character of the work which he/she intends to do after completion of studies. This statement may be written either in English or Afrikaans, but if written in Afrikaans a translation must accompany it.
- 5.4 FOUR photographs which must be of professional studio photographs unmounted 10cm x 15cm. Amateur snapshots will not be accepted.
- 5.5 Full details of any other bursaries held or which may have been applied for awaiting a reply.
- 5.6 **ADDITIONAL MATERIAL**
 - 5.6.1 TESTIMONIALS of not less than SIX (6) referees well acquainted with applicant, of whom at least THREE (3) are of his/her instructors under whom he/she has studied to be given on the application form.

PROCEDURE AFTER SELECTION

Immediately after receiving notice of his/her appointment, the graduate-elect should write to the University of which he/she would most wish to obtain admission.

The graduate-elect shall go into residence in October of the year for which he/she is elected, unless the Trustees decide otherwise. The first installment of the Scholarship will be paid at the beginning of the holder's first term at the University concerned. No request for earlier payment can be considered.

The graduate-elect must arrange with his/her Bankers for the necessary Exchange Control Authority for the funds he/she will require overseas. This application must include full details of the bursary which has been awarded.

The Selection Committee for the purpose of determining who shall hold the Scholarship(s) in constituted as follows:-

- ❖ The Judge President of the Supreme Court of South Africa, Free State Provincial Division, or his nominee.
- ❖ A judge of the Appellate Division of the Supreme Court of South Africa, or his nominee.
- ❖ The Rector of the University of the Free State, or his nominee.

Communications with this regard to Scholarships must in all cases be addressed to the Secretary and not to the Selection Committee or any individual member thereof.
