




What is an appeal?

NSFAS National Student Financial Aid Schem

An **appeal** is a request to review a decision not to fund a student who applied for NSFAS funding.






The NSFAS Appeals Policy makes provision for students whose funding has been rejected, to submit an appeal application.

Closing date for Appeals submission: To be communicated	
Communication of appeals decisions:	Regularly


FTEN Student/Applicant How to submit an appeal



LODGE APPEAL A student must lodge an appeal within 30 days of having been assessed as unsuccessful. **14 DAYS** \odot **30 DAYS** SUBMIT OUTSTANDING DOCUMENTS Any outstanding documentation related to the appeal must be submitted by the student/applicant within 14 days




Student sign in to myNSFAS portal with his/her username and Password



Appeal acceptance process












